

September Mission - Paul Webster Missionary Projects

Our September mission project is support for Paul Webster's projects at the Mujila Falls Agriculture Center in Kanyama, Zambia. We have been supporting the various projects for a number of years.



Paul was commissioned in 1992 as a missionary with the United Methodist Church Board of Global Ministries and has been serving in Zambia in recent years. He is a rural economic development specialist in Zambia promoting and carrying out major programs to help the Zambian Lunga peoples have a better life.

The work at the Agriculture Center has transformed life for the area by “attacking root causes of poverty, disease and hopelessness through education and training in small animal husbandry, cattle and goat milking, tree nurseries, and fruit, gardening and fish cultures at our research and demonstration sites,” according to Paul. “With God providing the resources—abundant land, water, plants and animals to Africa it is up to our Christian church to provide the knowledge, faith and hope for its people,” says Paul.

Born in New Richmond, Wisconsin and Peace Corp volunteer from 1980-1984 in Guatemala, Paul has done graduate work at the University of Minnesota. He served two churches Ladysmith and Tony, Wisconsin for two years while in Wisconsin on medical leave for his wife, Roxanne during her battle with cancer. Roxanne died in 2009 and Paul has been continuing their work there since then.
