

How to Set Up Scheduled Giving

Now that church services have been cancelled due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, church revenue is expected to decrease substantially. Although we may not be worshipping together in one place together, the ministries of the church are vital in our community. Scheduled giving is a way we can help during these difficult times.

You can set up a weekly or monthly automatic withdrawal through a checking/savings account or credit/debit card. You set up when you want the withdrawal to take place, how much you want withdrawn and how frequently. Each time a withdrawal is made you will receive an e-mail thanking you for your gift and your gift is automatically recorded in the church software.

To do this you will need to set up an account in Realm. You also need to have an active e-mail account and a phone number. If you want to do it just contact the church office at 920-743-3241 or Rod Krueger at 920-746-1026. The following will then happen.

1. I will send you an invitation from Realm to sign up. The site will be "onrealm.org". You will then have access to your profile in Realm. Much of the information may already be there. Be sure that you have listed a phone number and an e-mail address.

2. You will then go to "Giving" to put in information about the type of account you want to use and the proper information for it. You will fill in when you want a withdrawal to occur (1st of the month, 15th of the month etc.) and how much you want to withdraw and whether this is a one time gift or a recurring gift.

3. This isn't hard to do but it will be new to you. I would be more than willing to help you do it. We can set up a time when you are at your computer and I am at mine and I can walk you through it step by step. It will take 5 - 10 minutes.

I have been doing this for a couple of years and find it to be very convenient. If I am not able to attend church on a given Sunday, I know that I will still be supporting the church. I can check on my giving at any time just by logging in.
